



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REPORT

The annual cultural event, Yuvarambh 2025, was held on 8th February 2025 from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM, bringing together students, faculty, and dignitaries for a day of performances and celebrations. 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Yuvarambh 2025 was well-organized and successfully executed, providing students with an opportunity to display their talents while also fostering a sense of community among students, faculty, and management.



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
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Feedback Analysis:-
